Spokane area residents can make a clean air choice and save money! Spokane Regional Clean Air Agency is offering discounts when you replace your non-certified wood stove or insert with a new wood, pellet or natural gas device.

Please Note: Complete all sections of this application and retain a copy for your records. The Rebate Program is not responsible for materials lost by mail. Applications are processed in the order received. Rebate vouchers will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis to qualified homeowners who use wood as a heat source and who reside within the Spokane County Smoke Control Zone (see map on attached Rebate Program Flyer.) Funding is limited and not guaranteed unless a voucher has been issued. Vouchers will be good at participating retailers for an instant rebate off the price and professional installation of the device. Review additional program terms on the back, prior to signing below.

Please note: Purchase and installation costs vary, but typically start at around \$2,500.

Available rebates (discounts):

- **\$600** toward the purchase and professional installation of a new wood or pellet stove or insert and removal/disposal of your existing non-certified wood stove or insert
- **\$800** toward the purchase and professional installation of a new, natural gas stove or insert and removal/disposal of your existing non-certified wood stove or insert.

F. How the Rebate Program Works

1. Applications will be accepted beginning October 1, 2008, to the Agency's mailing address listed on the front. You must submit a photo of your current wood stove or fireplace insert with this application.
2. Spokane Clean Air staff reviews applications to determine if qualification requirements have been met.
3. Applicants are notified by mail regarding their qualification status.
4. Qualified applicants will receive a cover letter, a rebate voucher, and a list of participating retailers.
5. Rebate recipients must purchase their device from, and have it installed by, one of the participating retailers.
6. Once a selection has been made, the rebate recipient presents the rebate voucher to the retailer and schedules the installation. Please note that this could be several weeks out, based on the retailer's current job schedule.
7. The retailer will take a photo of the existing, non-certified device prior to removing it, and will also take a photo of the new device once it's installed.
8. The retailer will subtract the value of the rebate from the customer's bill prior to billing. The retailer will invoice Spokane Clean Air for the value of the rebate.

G. Rebate Program Terms

Important! Please read terms carefully. By applying, you are agreeing to the following provisions:

1. I am a homeowner residing within the Spokane County Smoke Control Zone (see map on the attached Rebate Program Flyer, if still unsure, call Spokane Clean Air at 477-4727.)
2. I have an installed and operating non-certified wood stove or insert that I use regularly during the heating season. (The device should have a label on the side or back, indicating make/year/model and if it meets EPA-certification standards. If not, contact Spokane Clean Air and we may be able to assist you.)
3. I agree to relinquish my old wood stove or insert to the retailer/installer when they install my new device. (The retailer will remove your existing device. If it's already pulled and sitting in a shed or backyard, etc., you will be disqualified from the rebate program.)
4. Existing gas appliances, furnaces, fireplaces and pellet devices do not qualify to be replaced under this program. Only non-certified wood burning stoves and inserts qualify for this program.
5. I understand that participants are limited to receiving one rebate voucher per address.
6. I understand that applications are processed in the order received. Rebates will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. Funding is limited, therefore rebates are not guaranteed.
7. I understand that if I qualify, I will receive a rebate voucher and a list of participating retailers who will honor the voucher if it is submitted by the expiration date written on the voucher.
8. I understand that I am responsible to pay the retailer for the purchase price and professional installation costs, less the rebate amount.
9. No retroactive rebates are available.
10. Please allow 2 – 4 weeks for processing voucher applications.
11. The Spokane Regional Clean Air Agency does not warranty any devices purchased under this rebate program, regarding the quality, functionality or satisfaction of the device.
